TRAVEL HEALTH FROM A – Z (ALTITUDE TO ZIKA)

What do travelers need to worry about during vacations, business trips and other global adventures? From altitude illness to headline news makers such as Zika, an overview (and some perspective!) will be presented. The general health risks of travel will be discussed, highlighting emerging diseases and some age old illnesses. The essential elements of travel health preparation, including routine and travel vaccinations, will be reviewed.

Ms. Wolfe has also served as a consultant to the US Centers for Disease Control (CDC) as a contributing author to Health Information for International Travel "The Yellow Book" and assisted with the review of a national health care provider course on yellow fever disease and vaccination. She has lived and volunteered in the developing world and continues to travel with her family.

Ms. Wolfe graduated from the University of Rochester, School of Nursing with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN). She received a Master in Public Health (MPH) from the Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health with concentrations in international health and health communication.
